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## **Executive Summary**

This report presents the analysis of faculty feedback collected on Syllabus and Its Transaction for the academic session 2025-26 at Chaiduar College, Gohpur. The survey covered key areas including participatory decision-making, academic freedom, infrastructure, facilities, administration, and overall satisfaction.

Responses were received on a 4-point Likert scale: Strongly Agree (SA), Agree (A), Disagree (D), and Strongly Disagree (SD). The data indicates mixed perceptions with strengths in certain facilities and notable areas requiring improvement, particularly in grievance handling, regularity of classes, and overall academic experience.

## Key Observations

### 1. Overall Positive Perception across Stakeholders

The majority of students, teachers, office staff, and alumni either *Strongly Agree* or *Agree* with all ten statements, indicating a high level of satisfaction with the syllabus design, relevance, and implementation.

### 2. Strong Faculty and Alumni Confidence

- Teachers show exceptionally high levels of Strong Agreement (60–78%) across all parameters.
- Alumni responses are also highly positive, with 55–75% Strongly Agree and 20–35% Agree, reflecting the continued relevance of the curriculum in real-life and professional contexts.

### 3. Syllabus Structure and Relevance Appreciated

- For Statement 1, nearly all stakeholders agree that the syllabus is well-structured and aligned with programme objectives.
- No significant dissatisfaction is observed among any stakeholder group.

### 4. Good Balance of Theory and Practice

- Statement 2 indicates strong support for the balance between theoretical and practical components.
- Teachers (75% Strongly Agree) particularly acknowledge the appropriateness of the curriculum design.

### 5. Curriculum Reflects Current Developments

- Statement 3 receives high agreement from all groups, suggesting that the syllabus is perceived as reasonably updated and contemporary.
- Student responses show a larger proportion in the "Agree" category, indicating scope for further modernization and inclusion of emerging trends.

### 6. Employability and Skill Development Focus

- Statement 4 records high positive responses, demonstrating that stakeholders believe the syllabus contributes to employability, entrepreneurship, and skill enhancement.
- Students show the highest Strong Agreement (35%) in this area.

### 7. Promotion of Critical Thinking and Research

- Statement 5 indicates that the curriculum supports analytical thinking, creativity, and research aptitude.
- Positive responses exceed 90% across all stakeholder groups.

### 8. Workload Distribution is Generally Appropriate

- Statement 6 shows overall satisfaction with the distribution of units, credits, and workload.
- A small proportion of students (4%) expressed disagreement, suggesting some concerns regarding workload balance.

### 9. Effective Teaching-Learning and Evaluation Support

- Statement 7 receives one of the highest approval ratings.
- Teachers report 98% positive responses, indicating confidence in existing pedagogical and assessment practices.

### 10. Learning Resources Need Further Strengthening

- Statement 8 receives comparatively lower Strong Agreement among students (22%) and office staff (45%).
- Some teachers (5%) disagree, indicating that library, ICT, laboratory, and digital learning resources may require enhancement.

## 11. Interdisciplinary and Value-Based Learning Well Integrated

- Statement 9 receives favorable responses from all stakeholders.
- However, a small proportion of students (5%) disagree, suggesting room for strengthening interdisciplinary exposure.

## 12. High Overall Satisfaction with the Curriculum

- Statement 10 reflects overall satisfaction with syllabus design, relevance, and delivery.
- Positive responses exceed 85% among all stakeholder groups, indicating broad acceptance of the curriculum.

# Recommendations

## 1. Regular Curriculum Revision

- Continue periodic syllabus reviews to incorporate emerging developments, industry requirements, technological advancements, and contemporary issues.

## 2. Enhance Practical and Experiential Learning

- Increase project-based learning, internships, fieldwork, case studies, simulations, and laboratory-based activities to strengthen practical exposure.

## 3. Strengthen Employability Components

- Introduce more skill-oriented, vocational, certification, and entrepreneurship-related modules aligned with current job market demands.

## 4. Improve Learning Resources

- Upgrade library resources, digital databases, ICT infrastructure, laboratory facilities, and e-learning platforms to support effective syllabus delivery.

## 5. Promote Interdisciplinary Learning

- Encourage cross-disciplinary courses, value-added programmes, and multidisciplinary projects to broaden students' perspectives.

## 6. Review Workload Distribution

- Examine student feedback regarding course load and assessment schedules to ensure a balanced and manageable academic workload.

## 7. Expand Research and Innovation Opportunities

- Provide more opportunities for student research projects, innovation activities, publication support, and participation in seminars and conferences.

## 8. Strengthen Industry-Academia Linkages

- Increase collaboration with industry experts, alumni, and professional bodies for curriculum enrichment, guest lectures, and career-oriented training.

## 9. Enhance Continuous Feedback Mechanisms

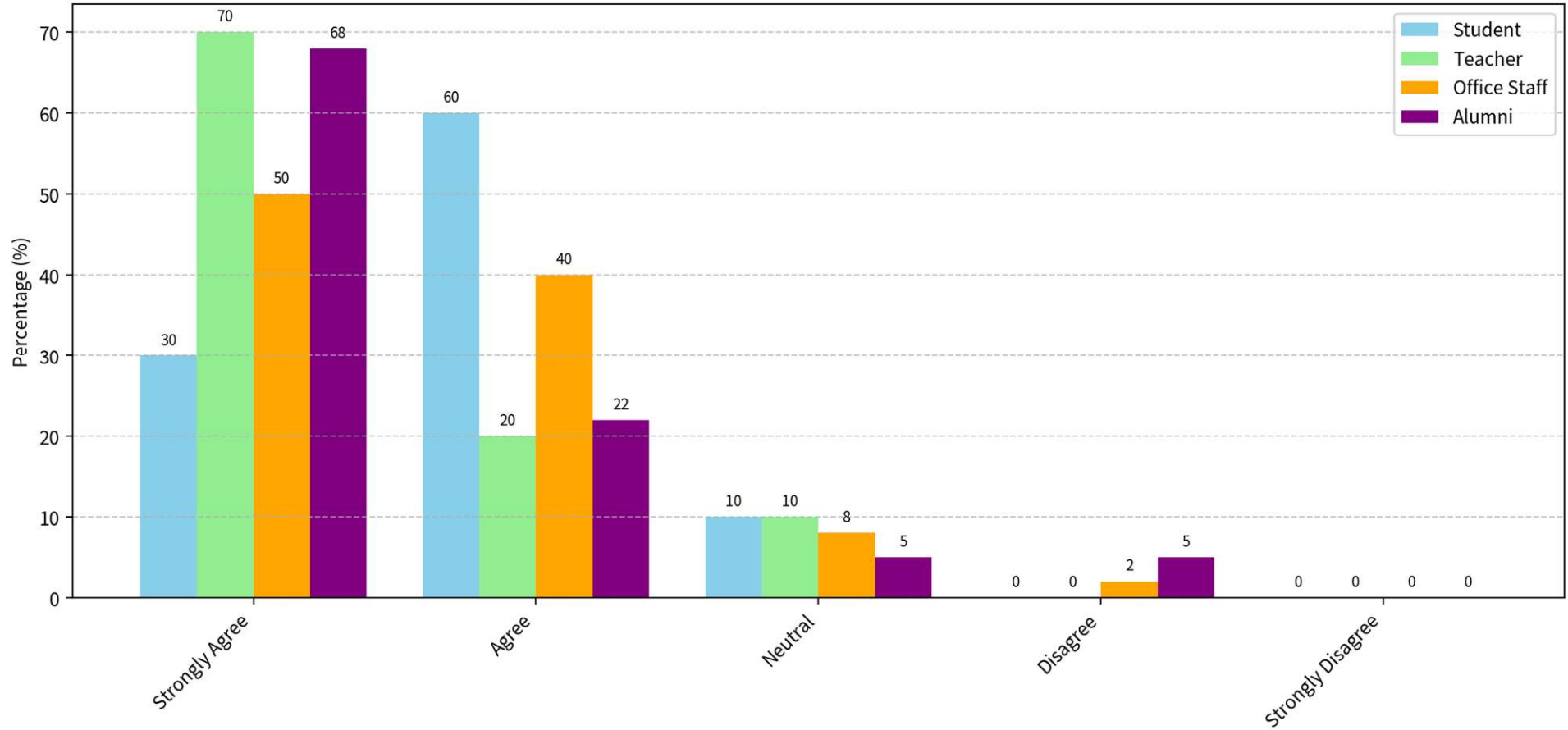
- Conduct regular stakeholder feedback surveys and systematically incorporate suggestions into curriculum planning and revision processes.

## 10. Maintain Existing Strengths

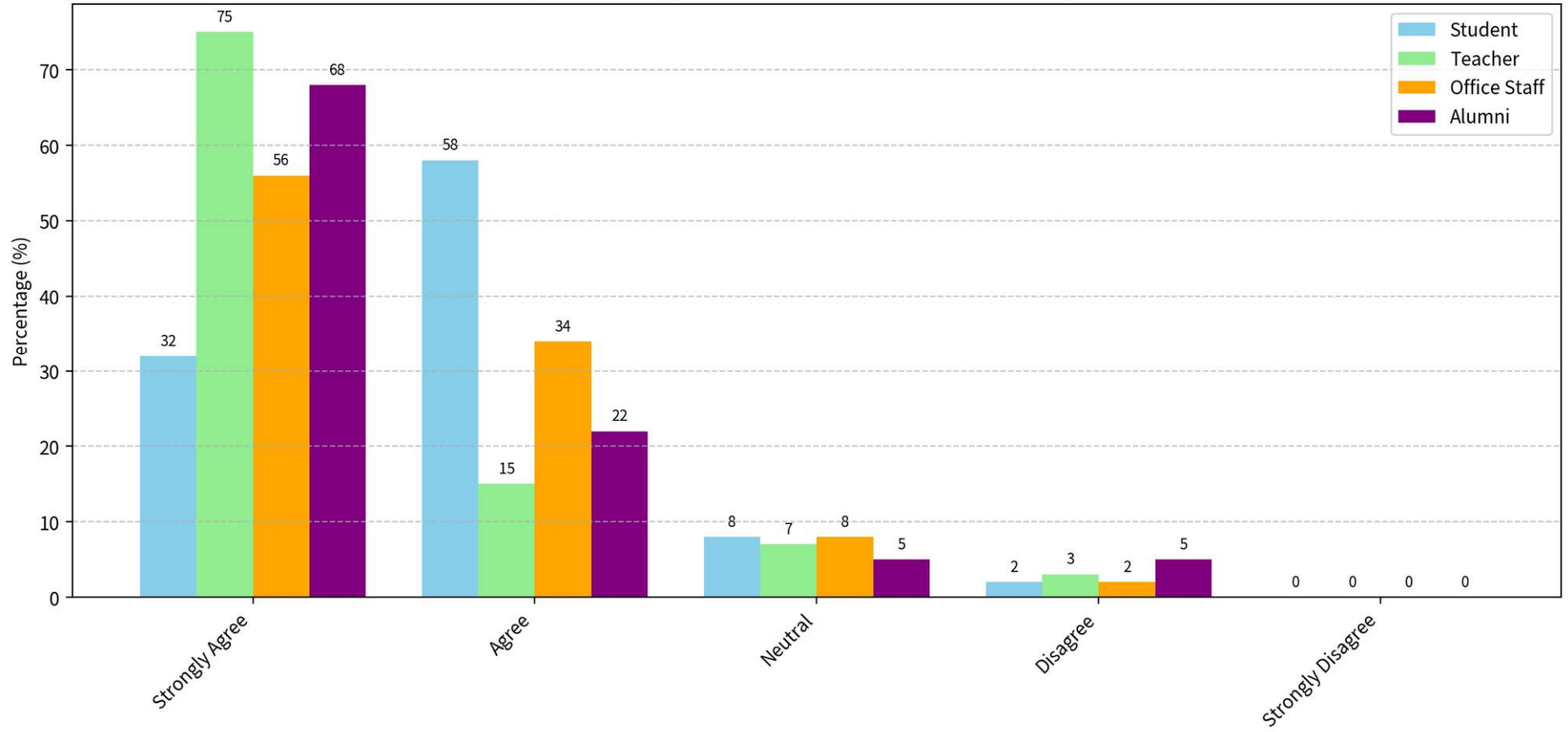
- Preserve the well-structured nature of the syllabus, effective teaching-learning practices, and strong stakeholder satisfaction levels while pursuing continuous improvement.

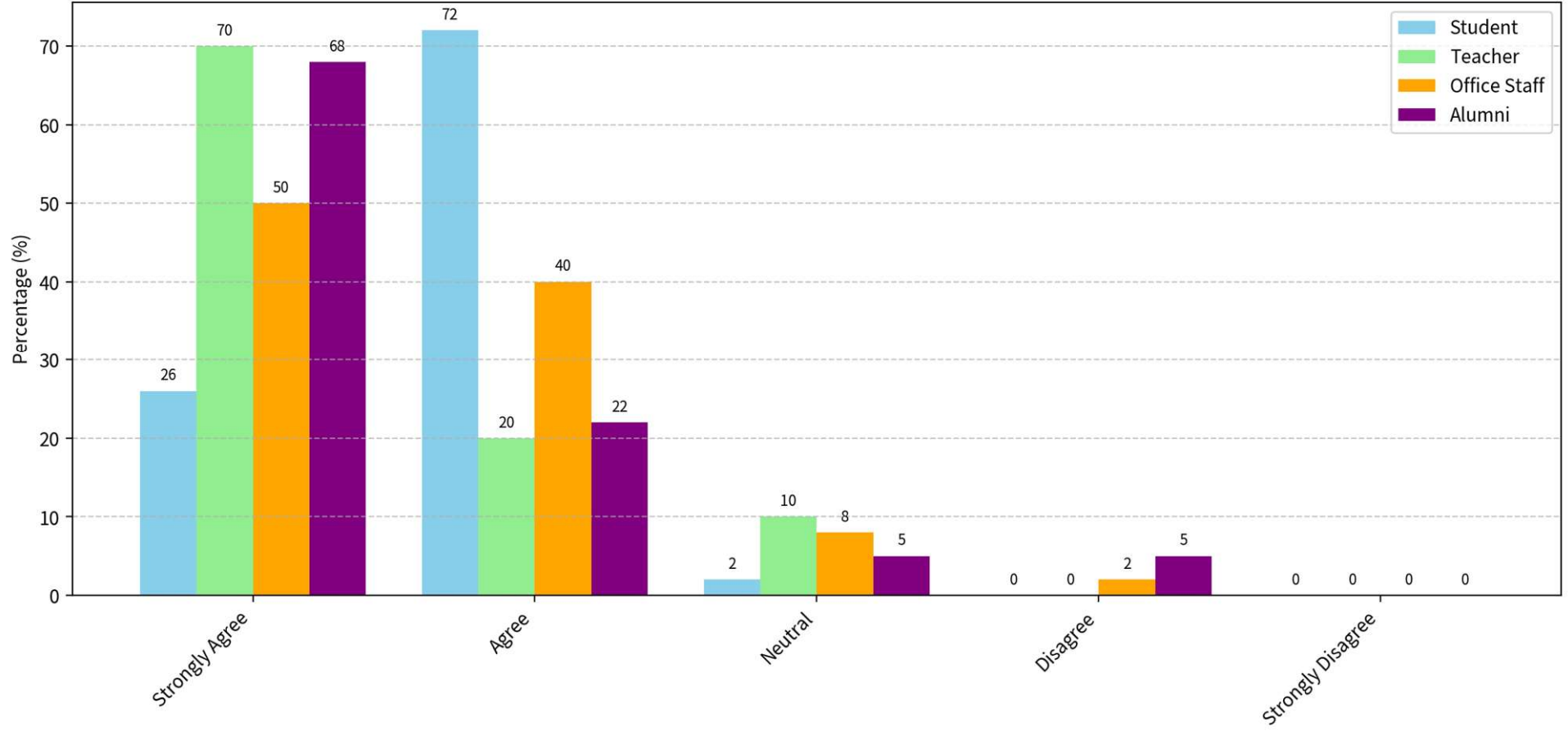

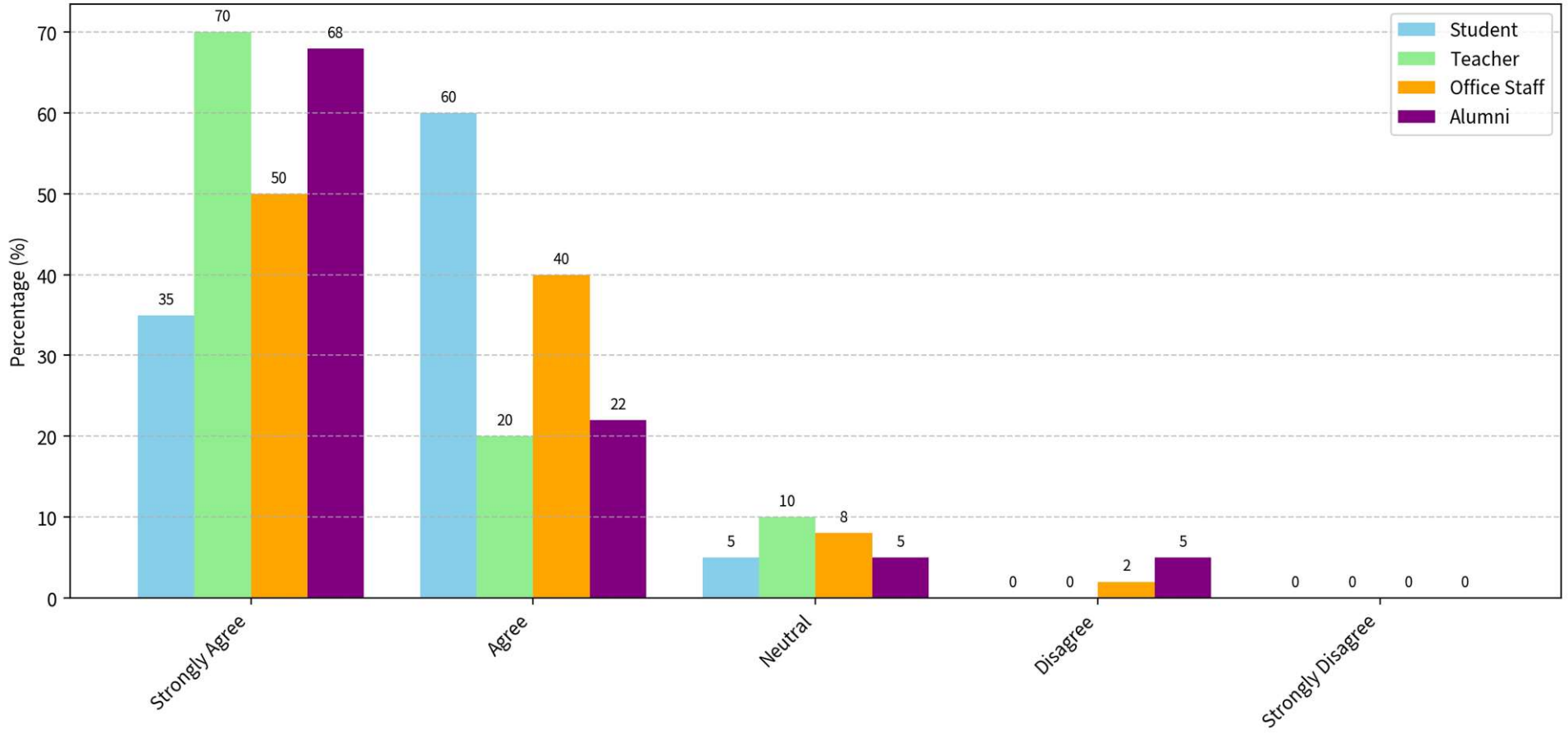
Statement 2: The syllabus has a good balance between theoretical and practical components.



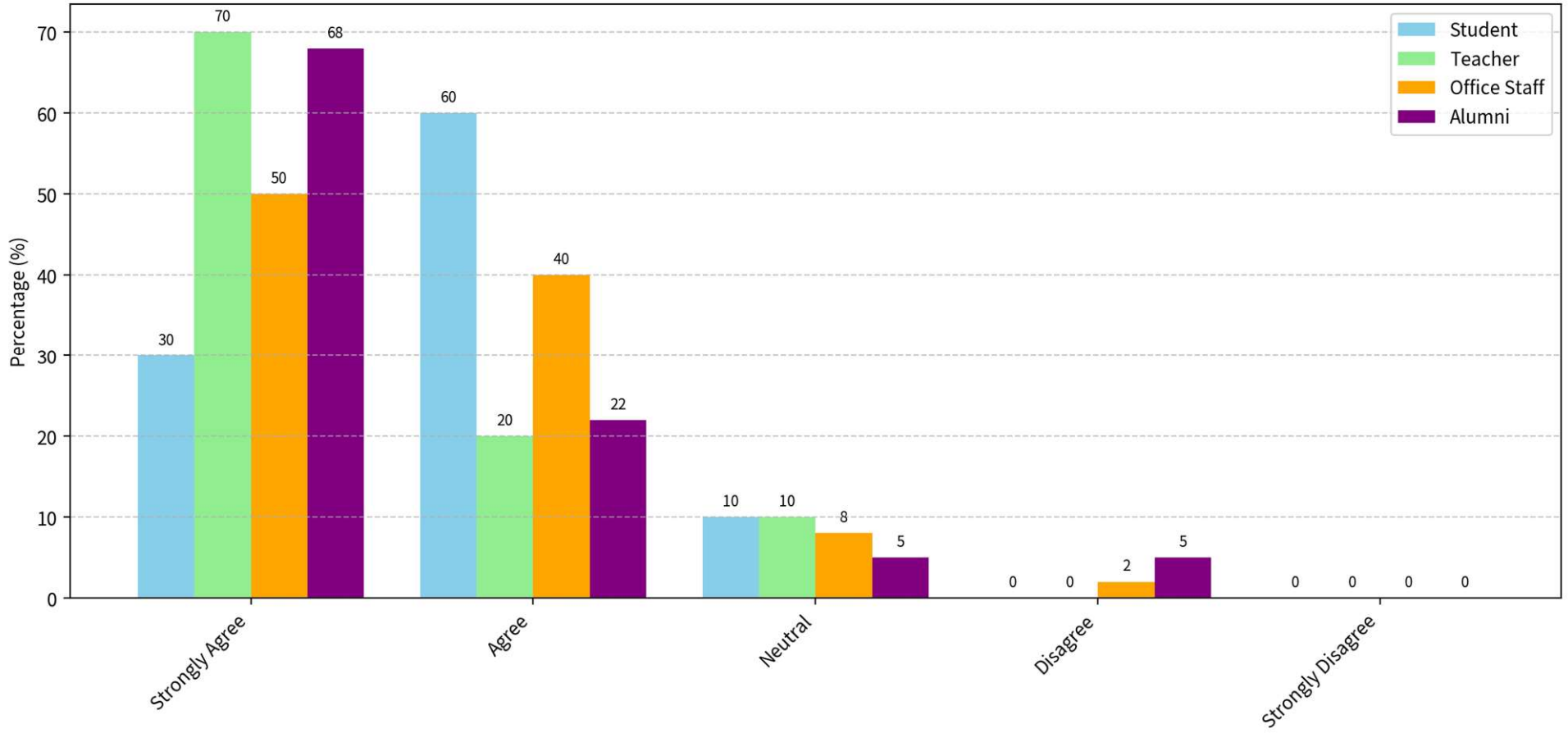
Statement 3: The syllabus content is updated and reflects current developments in the field.



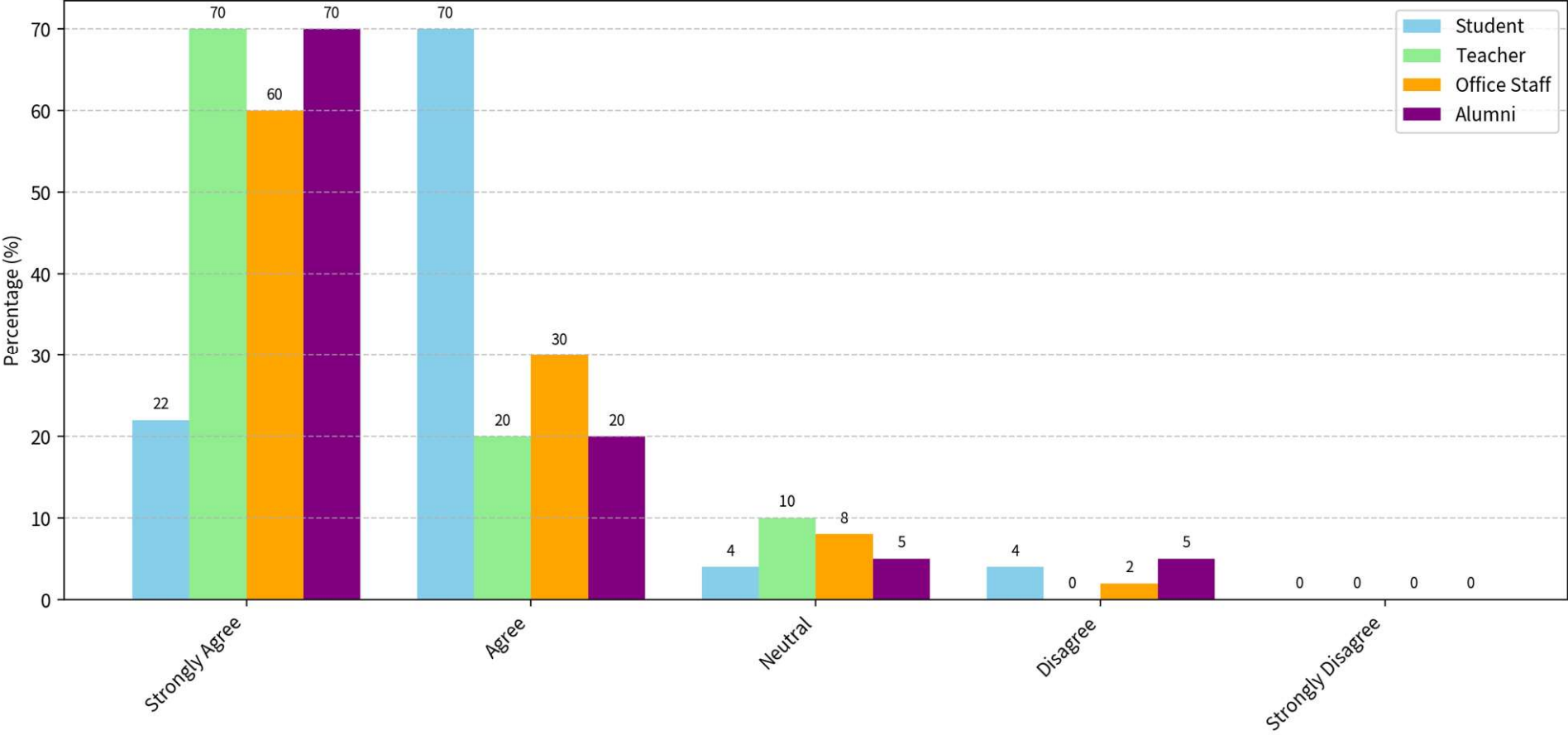
Statement 4: The syllabus promotes employability, skill development and entrepreneurship



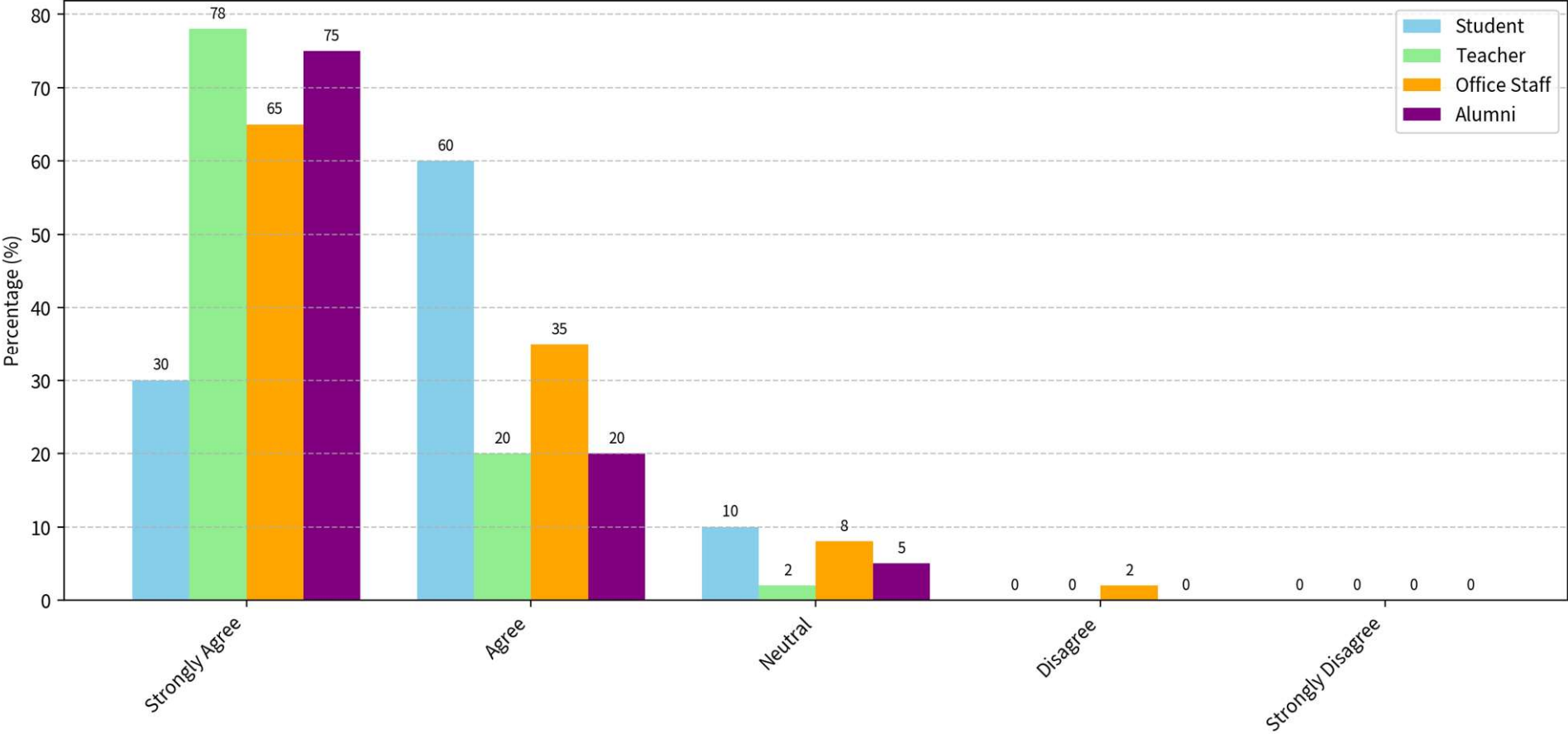

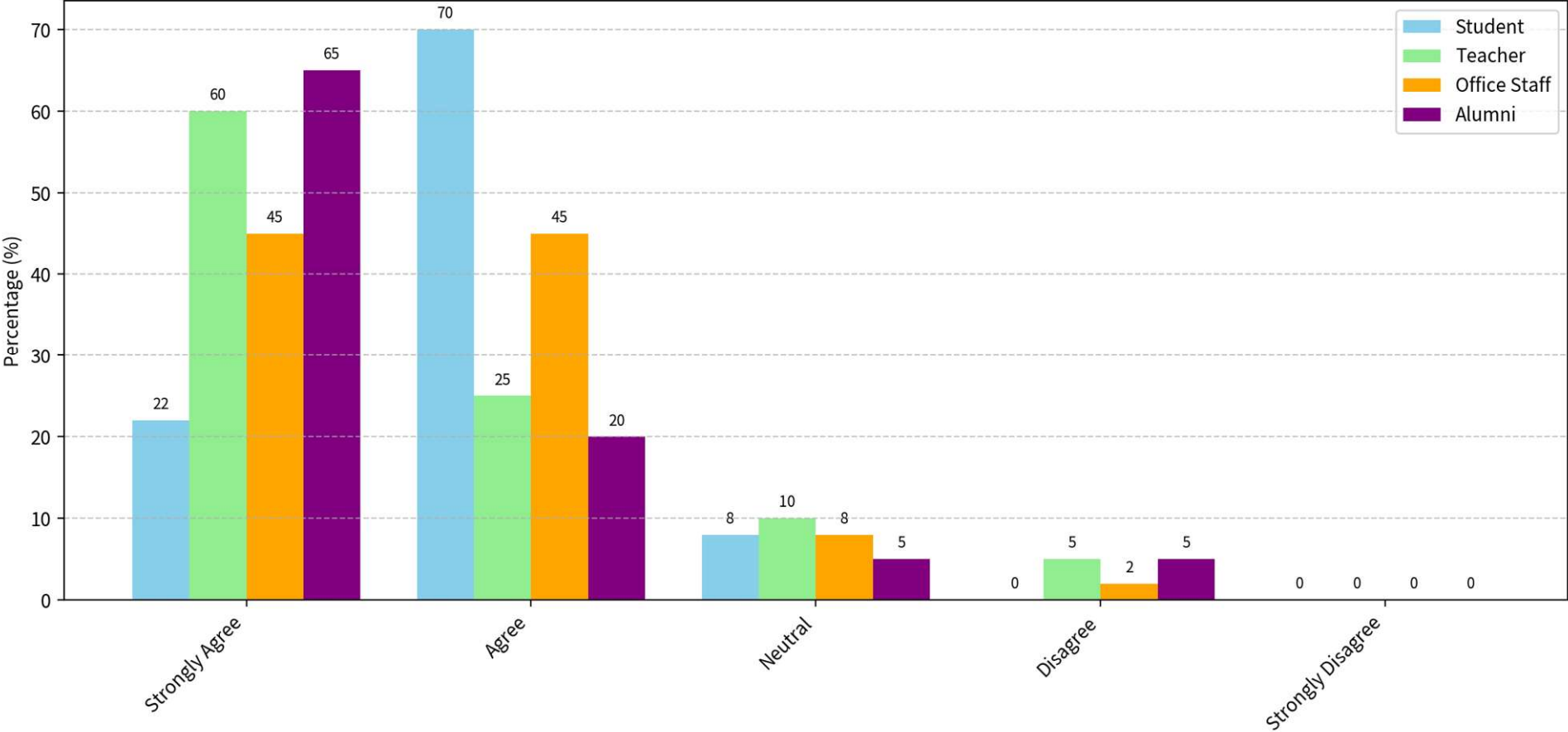

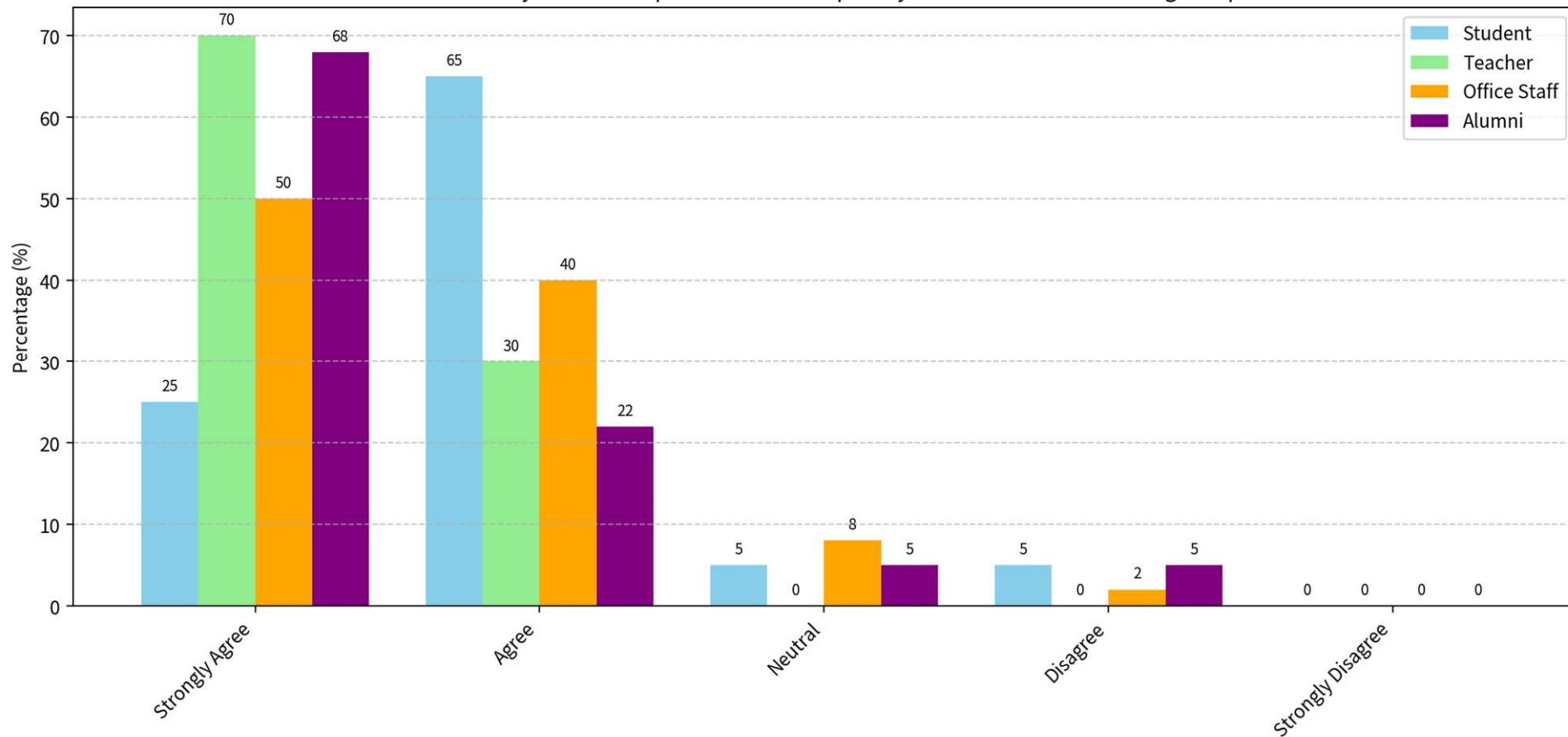
